If you've ever been inspired by history and literature to sail on a tall ship, join us on the deck of a square-rigger, sailing through tropical Caribbean waters.


Sea Cloud II is an exhilarating journey back to the golden age of sea travel. She flies 26 sails — nearly 30,000 square feet of canvas — the old-fashioned way, by hand. She is the largest and most luxurious square-rigged tall ship available for passenger travel, of which she carries only 86 guests at a time.

If you want to get a sense of what travel was like in the last century (albeit with more comfort), learn about navigation and sailing, explore a diverse group of Caribbean islands, and be in inspiring company — then sail with us aboard *Sea Cloud II* from **January 30-February 6, 2009**.

Visit lovely anchorages most travelers haven't seen, including Bequia (the Grenadines), and Iles des Saintes with time for swimming and snorkeling. The undersea life is vibrant with angelfish, parrotfish and damselfish. You'll also explore the natural world ashore, such as on the island of Dominica where you can hike in pristine forests and search for iguanas and parrots. Your expedition leader, historian and naturalist will add tremendously to your understanding of these islands.

Explore the Caribbean — Expedition-Style

Learn about reef ecology as you snorkel (we provide gear) among colorful corals and tropical fish.

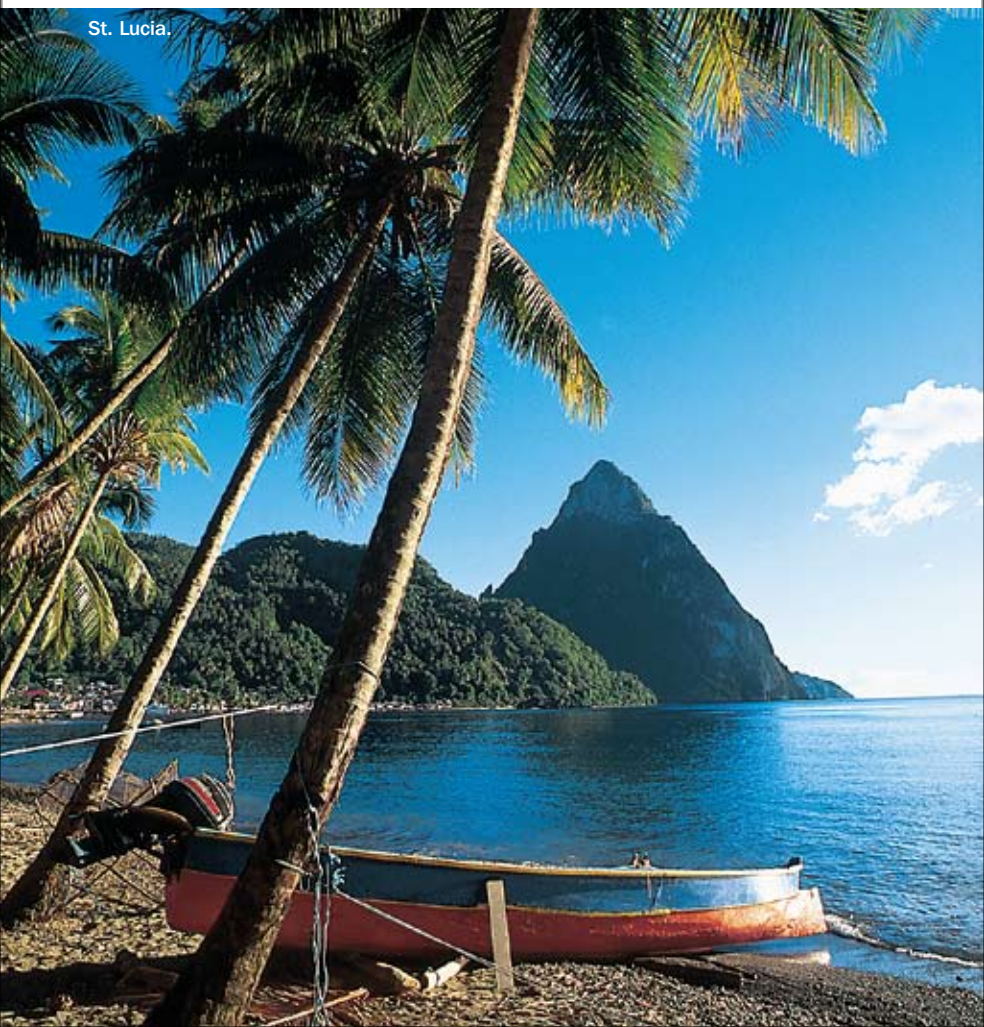
It's hard to describe the experience one has while sailing aboard *Sea Cloud II*. As you witness the constellation of sails filled with warm trade winds and the mesmerizing action as the crew climbs aloft, you will feel an incredible sense of exhilaration.

Swim, snorkel or walk

up to the ruins of an 18th-century fort with our Historian. Visit Iles des Saintes' shops, galleries and cafés in a traditional French village. And in true Lindblad spirit, attire on board is completely casual.

DAY 1: U.S./BARBADOS/EMBARK (D)

DAY 2: UNDER SAIL

Experience one of the great pleasures of travel anywhere: sailing aboard our barque, seeing the crew go aloft unfurling the sails the traditional way — by hand. (B,L,D)

DAY 3: DOMINICA/ILES DES SAINTES

Dominica is called the “Nature Island” because of its beauty and many reserves. Hike through an enchanting rain forest, walk up to the ruins of 18th-century Fort Shirley with our Historian, or go for a swim and snorkel. In the evening we anchor at beautiful Iles des Saintes. After dinner, discover the nightlife ashore on your own. (B,L,D)

DAY 4: ILES DES SAINTES/UNDER SAIL

Iles des Saintes is decidedly French in character. Visit the town’s shops, galleries and cafés, don some snorkeling gear (which we’ll gladly provide), or walk up to Fort Napoleon. Sail in the Guadeloupe Channel, where the winds fill the square sails in a glorious spectacle. Conditions permitting, we’ll lower Zodiacs so you can get great photographs of the *Sea Cloud II* under sail. (B,L,D)

DAY 5: UNDER SAIL/SOUFRIÈRE & LES PITONS, ST. LUCIA

After a morning’s sailing, we anchor under the iconic twin peaks of St. Lucia, called “Les Pitons.” Drive through the active crater, plunge under a tropical waterfall, explore the beautiful botanical gardens, and finish with an incredible view from the hills above. (B,L,D)

DAY 6: UNDER SAIL/BEQUIA, THE GRENADINES

After a morning's sailing, we arrive at tiny Bequia. Stroll the waterfront, swim and snorkel, or visit the sea turtle sanctuary. Have dinner aboard or, take in the laid-back evening scene ashore. (B,L,D)

DAY 7: THE GRENADINES/UNDER SAIL

Continue exploring the Grenadines. Take a final swim and snorkel before the *Sea Cloud II* sails back to Barbados. (B,L,D)

DAY 8: BARBADOS/DISEMBARK/HOME (B)

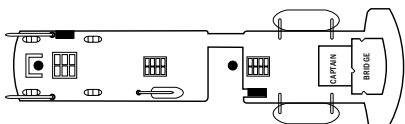

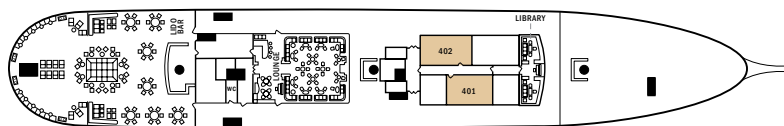

SEA CLOUD II DECK PLAN

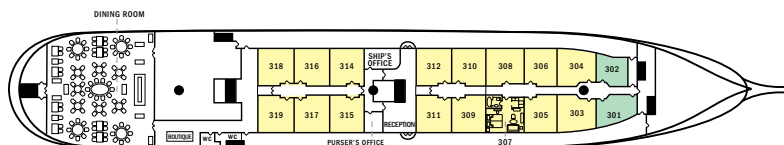

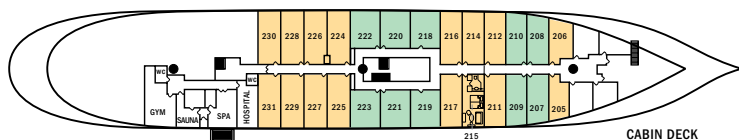

Cabin Deck 211, 212, 214-217, 224-231 – Located on the Cabin Deck these cabins have two portholes, sofa, table, queen-size bed with two separate mattresses. Sole Occupancy: 205, 206 – Cabins are in the traditional windjammer style with upper and lower beds. They are located on the Cabin Deck each with two portholes, chair, table.

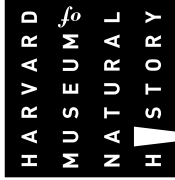
